

Pupil Premium - impact 2016/2017

GCSE results

- 27% of our pupils at Abbey Grange were eligible for the Pupil Premium in 2017. This has stayed very consistent for the last three years and is extremely close to the national average of 28%
- Pupil Premium Progress 8 score in 2017 was 0.2 which means our disadvantaged students made better overall progress than non-disadvantaged students nationally (0.1)
- The progress of our disadvantaged students in 2017 places us in the top 16% nationally and is a fantastic improvement on our Progress 8 score of -0.4 in 2016 when we were ranked in the bottom 40% of schools nationally. This figure in 2017 was also achieved with a larger cohort
- The progress of our disadvantaged students in English is very good, we are ranked in the top 13% of schools nationally. We are ranked in the top 34% of schools nationally in mathematics
- 68% of our disadvantaged students achieved a grade 4+ in English and mathematics compared to 63% of all pupils nationally and a figure of 71% for non-disadvantaged pupils nationally
- 79% of our disadvantaged students achieved a grade 4+ in English Language compared to a figure of 73% nationally for non-disadvantaged students and 67% nationally for all students
- 68% of our disadvantaged students achieved a grade 4+ in mathematics which nearly meets the 69% of all pupils nationally but is 8% lower than the national figure for non-disadvantaged
- 28% of our disadvantaged students achieved the English Baccalaureate which is the same as non-disadvantaged nationally and 4% higher than all pupils nationally
